After half term we will be adopting the ACE way of working. We have blocked our foundation subjects and will be working on a Science and English linked experience within journals. Some subjects will be continuing as weekly lessons, such as PE, RE, PHSE and French and of course, Maths and phonics will continue to be taught daily. I look forward to sharing with you later this term, the work the children are producing.

Attendance is something we monitor closely, and whilst we appreciate children do become ill the odd day here and there soon adds up. There are very few circumstances where a term time holiday would be approved and we would urge you to think very carefully before booking any holiday as this could incur a fine.

Thank you to all those parents who are working with their children to promote home reading and maintain the reading records. February half term can often be a little wet and cold, so an ideal chance to go to the library and explore some ideas for world book day.

KS2

Squirrel class have settled well into 2024, starting with a new book in English. This term, the focus has been on the wonderful book entitled 'How to live forever' by the author Colin Thompson. Using the book as inspiration, we have been working on speech in writing and descriptive writing.

Our topic in History has been exploring the Victorian era. The focus has been primarily comparing and contrasting the different experiences of children then and now, looking at classrooms and leisure time amongst other areas. Last week we looked at the rules and

expectations in Victorian classrooms, and explored the reality that education wasn't open to everyone.

I have been particularly impressed at the effort the whole class shown in their Maths lessons this term. It has been a privilege to share in a number of personal successes and achievements by a number of pupils, who have pushed themselves and shown improved levels of determination and resilience!

In RE we have been looking at the foundations of Islam while MFL has moved to French.

At the start of the term we looked at how to build structures in DT. We looked at how homes were built in Bangladesh to survive Monsoon conditions and used that as an inspiration for our small structures. Working in small groups we had great fun trialing different materials and designs to combat strong wind, rain and flooding.

It's hard to believe we are almost half way through this academic year. Year 3 have settled in so well, and Year 6 are working hard on their SATS preparations. We are looking forward to the upcoming Art and Science modules.

KS1

We seem to have hit the ground running this term and the children are working hard. This hard work is particularly obvious in their writing, which is really impressing me at the moment. Each child is challenging themself, with neater handwriting, more interesting sentences and improved volume.

In maths, reception and year one have been learning about partitioning numbers and understanding addition and subtraction facts. For example, knowing that 5 can be partitioned into 2 and 3 or 16 can be partitioned into 13 and 3. Year 2 have progressed their knowledge of 2,5, and 10 times tables and the link with division. In the last couple of weeks all children have been looking at weighing and measuring. Answering questions about the tallest and shortest item and considering the difference between grams and kilograms.

Our History topic 'Schools Over Time' has been a great success and we have enjoyed learning about the similarities and differences over time. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the children's questionnaires, it provided us with a wealth of information. I think it is safe to say that school dinners were not very popular!

We were also incredibly fortunate to share some old art sketchbooks sent in by a kind Grandparent. These belonged to her parents and were nearly 100 years old. There was also a news article sharing how a young girl had progressed from student to teacher. The children were spellbound and I must admit to being a little nervous handling such precious items.

Reception children have had a little trip to space in the role-play area and have used the resources to act out familiar stories, such as Jack and the Beanstalk. These areas create great opportunities for children to be creative, work collaboratively, rehearse new vocabulary and learn through play.

In computing children have learnt about animation, through flip books and stop frame animation. The classroom was recently filled with laughter as children created their own stop frame animation. It was great fun.

RE has explored elements of the Islamic faith and the belief that everyone has a responsibility to care for the world, including animals. There have been many conversations about caring for pets and forgetting to clean out cages!

We are still missing Mrs Evans, who is busy caring for her daughter. She keeps in regular contact and is helping out behind the scenes as much as possible. I know she is missing the children greatly and will be back with us as soon as she can. Mrs Newman continues to cover two days a week and we are extremely grateful for her time.


Once again thank you for your support and thank you to the wonderful team at school that support Hedgehogs everyday.
