Squirrel Class

I have thoroughly enjoyed my first five weeks at Ashill and getting to know the children has been a real highlight.

This week, we had the privilege of a Black History Month Art workshop. The children worked together to create some wonderful pieces of art, whilst learning about the importance of Black History Month. We have also made the most of National Poetry Day to inspire our poems written to celebrate Harvest Festival.

In English, we have been studying the book, "Brother Eagle Sister Sky," by Susan Jeffers as part of our fiction unit and from this we have developed some wonderful settings for the new characters developed. We will shortly be moving onto the non fiction text, "Wild Animals of the North," by Dieter Braun. Both of these texts were chosen to link with our geography work about North America.

Kyra and Rosa, our school Science Ambassadors, spent an exciting day at Redstart Primary School this week, enjoying the chance to undertake various science investigations. We are looking forward to a demonstration of all they have learnt, soon.

We will shortly be moving onto our next curriculum block of Science, investigating the properties of materials - the knowledge organiser will be coming soon...

Hedgehog Class

Amazingly, we have already completed the first month of the school year. It has been a great start to the term and the children have worked hard. We are particularly proud of the reception children who have made a very positive start and settled in beautifully.

Reception children have started to learn the phonics sounds and are developing their pencil control to write these sounds. We use a variety of activities to improve children's fine motor skills to develop the strength and dexterity for a variety of tasks, such as writing. For example, children have recently enjoyed snipping a variety of plants from Mrs Bulgin's garden. They have also enjoyed the different smells and textures and there has been a lot of conversation around the table. It was great fun...even if the classroom does now smell of leeks!

Year 1 and 2 have continued to extend their phonics knowledge with daily sessions and are applying this in their writing. Drawing Club remains popular and the children have enjoyed using their imagination to meet challenges linked to the weekly story. They particularly enjoyed watching a Looney Tunes Road Runner cartoon story and created their own tricks to play on the coyote.

In maths children have spent some time recognising 2D and 3D shapes. They have also used a number line or hundred square to find 1 or 10 more than a given number.

In the afternoon's children learnt about the seasons and looked for signs of Autumn. They have also used natural items to create art. During music sessions the children have explored a jig and are learning the song 'As I was Walking Down the Street'. They have enjoyed watching Irish dancers and marching to the beat of the song. I wonder if they can sing you the song.

We have had a busy and changeable start to the term. We would like to welcome our new starters to the setting and we are so pleased to say that they have settled really well and are beginning to make firm friendships.



This term we have been learning about Autumn and the different changes that will happen. The children have enjoyed many different Autumn activities such as leaf painting, collecting leaves on our first welly walk with the reception children and playing and sorting conkers, acorns and leaves in the tuff tray.

We have also started to explore 'all about me'. The children made their own paper plate person, listened to the ebook, 'we are all different' which opened up discussions about ourselves and how we are different or the same.

The children played sound bingo and listened really well to the sounds and found the matching pictures, they also helped to make playdough, taking turns to add ingredients to the bowl and stir them in. We have continued to make use of the nice weather by having water play outside using the water tray and water wall as well as playing on the ride on toys. The children explored the trim trail and played in the play house pretending to be the '3 little pigs'.

We have had many opportunities to go up to KS1 to play in their classroom and outside spaces. The children have enjoyed reconnecting with the children who left to start school and build new friendships with the other children and the teachers.
